

## **Spring Flower, Fruit, Vegetable and Photography Show**

The show takes place on **Wednesday, May 1, 2019** at the **Columbus Community Centre**, 232 Spencer Street East at D'Arcy, prior to the monthly general meeting.

Entries will be received from 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. at the Columbus Community Centre. No late entries please. Judging begins at 7:30 p.m. Contact: Shelly Fredericks 289-771-2244.

Through the generosity of the late Mabs Perrin, a sum of money was donated to the Cobourg Garden Club with a request that a \$50 prize be awarded every year to an exhibitor with "the best Spring flower".

Participants may enter up to 3 different cultivars in most classes except those marked with an asterisk. Please name each cultivar if possible.

### **SECTION A: Narcissus (Daffodil) Foliage is not attached**

- Class 1: Trumpet (e.g. – King Alfred), 1 stem
- Class 2: Large cupped, 1 stem
- Class 3: Small cupped, 1 stem
- Class 4: Double bloom, yellow, 1 stem
- Class 5: Double bloom, white, 1 stem
- Class 6: Bi-colour single, 1 stem
- Class 7: Bi-colour double, 1 stem
- Class 8: Miniature, 3 stems
- Class 9: Any other species, 1 stem
- Class 10: Collection in a vase, 3 stems

### **SECTION B: Tulips (1 or 2 leaves attached)**

- Class 1: Single, 1 stem
- Class 2: Double, 1 stem
- Class 3: Any other tulip (e.g. – lily flowered, parrot, etc.), 1 stem

### **SECTION C:**

- Class 1: Hyacinth, 1 stem
- Class 2: Any other Spring bulb, 1 stem (e.g. – Anemone blanda)
- Class 3: Any other Spring flower, 1 stem (e.g. – Dicentra, Bleeding Heart)

### **SECTION D:**

- Class 1: Allium, 1 large stem
- Class 2: Allium, 3 small stems

### **SECTION E:**

- Class 1: Collection of Spring flowers in a vase, 3 named varieties

**SECTION F:**

Class 1: Iris, 1 spike, any type or colour, no foliage

Class 2: Flowering shrub, in bloom, 1 branch, not to exceed 30 inches

**SECTION G: Houseplants**

Class 1: African Violet, single

Class 2: African Violet, double

Class 3: Any houseplant in bloom, named

Class 4: Any houseplant grown mainly for foliage, named

Class 5: Cactus, any type, named if known

Class 6: Succulent, any type, named if known

Class 7: Orchid, any type, named

**SECTION H: Design (Purchased materials allowed)**

Class 1: A design using foliage and/or branches

Class 2: A design to include Spring flowers

Class 3: Pot et Fleur – An exhibit containing a potted plant with soil (in or out of pot) and cut flowers (in tubes of water or oasis) together in one design, assembled in one container. Moss, decorative wood and rock may be used to help hide mechanics (tubes, pot, floral frog, etc.) of design. Branches are permitted. Cut foliage is prohibited.

**SECTION I: Fruits and Vegetables**

Class 1: Any Spring fruit or vegetable, 3 specimens

**\*SECTION J: Photography – Participants may enter one photograph in each class. It must contain a horticultural topic.**

Class 1: “Spring is in the Air!”

Class 2: Wildflowers

Class 3: Water in the Garden
